What is the 10YFP?

Secretariat



*It is a global framework for action to enhance international cooperation to accelerate the shift towards SCP in **both** developed and developing countries.*

*Creating “**collective impact**” for a shift to SCP patterns, bringing together and scaling up initiatives, projects and policies by many actors - governmental, private sector and civil society.*





10YFP Main Objectives

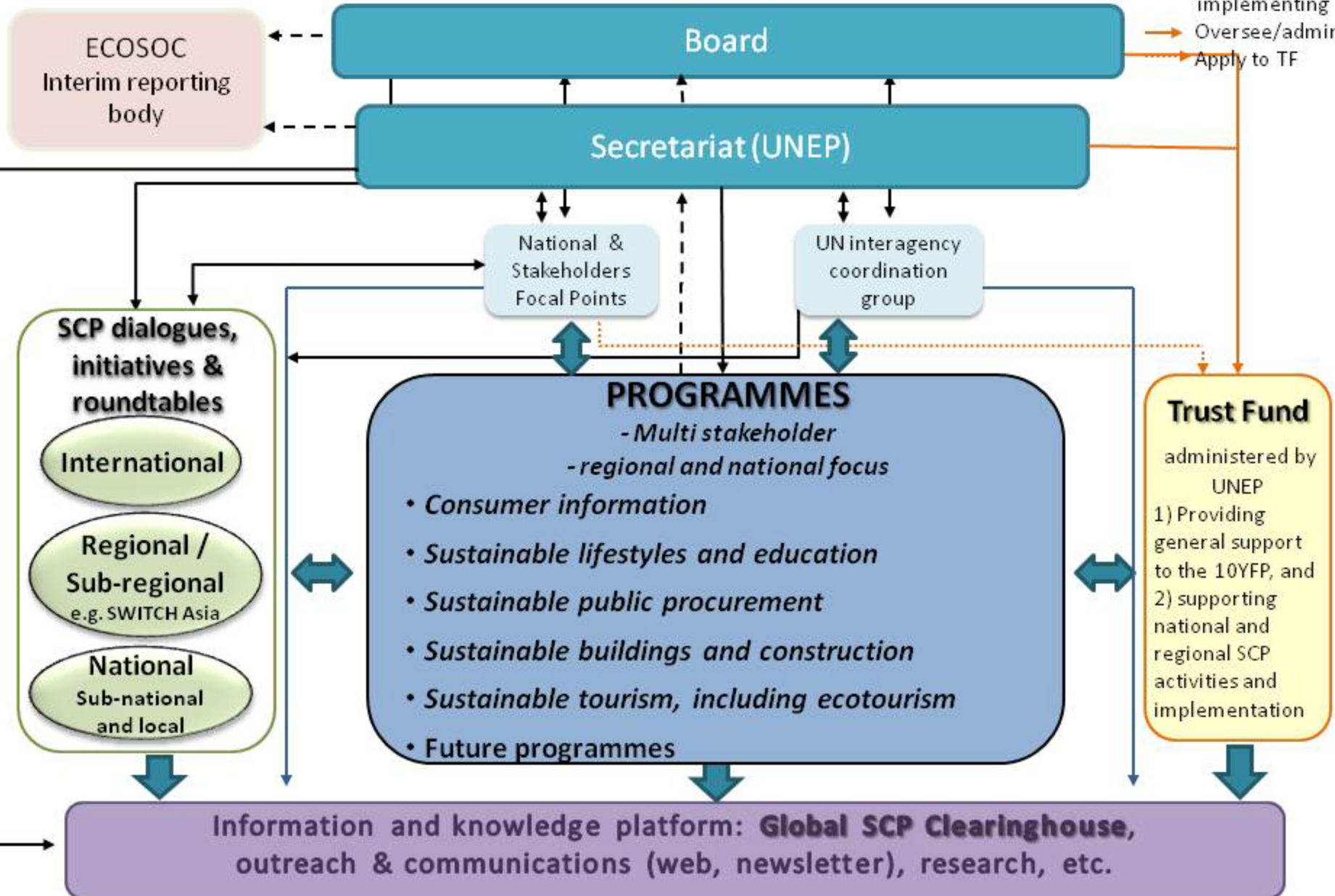


- **Accelerate the shift towards SCP in all countries** by supporting regional and national policies and initiatives.
- **Increase resource efficiency and decouple economic growth from environmental degradation, creating decent job and economic opportunities**, contributing to **poverty eradication and shared prosperity**.
- Support **capacity-building** and facilitate access to **financial and technical assistance for developing countries**, supporting the implementation of SCP activities at all levels.
- Serve as an **information and knowledge sharing platform on SCP to enable all stakeholders** to exchange policies, tools, initiatives and best practices, enhancing cooperation

First 10YFP Board meeting

Inaugural meeting: 1-2 October 2013, New York

- Election of Chair (**Mexico**) and Vice-Chair (**Indonesia**)
- Adopted their ToRs and working procedures
- Reviewed progress on the initial list of programmes, and adoption of the 5-step model
- Discussed criteria to select new programmes (responding to countries & stakeholders demands)
- Developed procedures to administer the Trust Fund
- Developed milestones for the first year





National Focal Points

Secretariat



To date, over 108 countries have nominated their national focal points.

Some of them are already taking action:

- Coordinating country's participation in the 10YFP
- Exchanging and disseminating info on SCP policies, activities, events, including through the [Global SCP Clearinghouse](#) and supporting development of “country profiles”
- Developing national SCP action plans/programmes
- Organising national inter-ministerial and/or multistakeholder SCP Roundtables





Stakeholder Focal Points Nomination Process



Deadline was 30 September, extended to 30 October 2013.

Nominations received:

Consultations are still ongoing for:

Inter-Agency Coordination Group

Objectives: ensure UN cooperation in the implementation of the 10YFP, identifying synergies and joint projects (e.g. programmes, research, trainings, implementation).

Activities:

- 19 Agencies have joined
- The first meeting was held in May 2013
- TORs adopted
- Co-Chair UNDESA together with UNEP (secretariat)



- **4th Arab Regional Roundtable** (June 2013, in Cairo, Egypt), organized by **LAS, ESCWA, CEDARE and UNEP**. Brought together **newly appointed national focal points (NFPs)**, and other stakeholders. Main outcome: **regional Roadmap to implement the 10YFP**.
- **7th Latin America and the Caribbean Expert meeting on SCP**, gathered all NFPs from the region and other stakeholders. **Provided policy recommendations** for the **LAC Forum of Ministers of Environment** on **regional implementation of SCP and the 10YFP**. Requested an additional programmes on SMEs, food and waste.



- **WEOG meeting of National Focal Points** (July, Paris) discussed role of NFPs, highlighting need for **national inter-ministerial dialogues** to implement 10YFP. Called for **launch programmes as soon as possible**.
- **Asia and the Pacific First 10YFP Regional Meeting**, (November, Bangkok) (back to back with SWITCH Asia workshops), gathered NFP and other stakeholders, discuss regional inputs for the 5 programmes. Development of a regional roadmap.
- **Africa, Workshop on regional initiatives on SCP and the global 10YFP**, Oct, Gaborone, Botswana (back to back to AMCEN) ... Next steps: ARSCP and Switch Africa!!

Initial List of Programmes:

“A flexible, initial and non-exhaustive list ... This indicative list builds on the experience gained through the Marrakech Process, including those areas identified in the regional SCP roundtables, strategies and action plans, inter alia: “

- i. Consumer information;
- ii. Sustainable lifestyles and education;
- iii. Sustainable public procurement;
- iv. Sustainable buildings and construction;
- v. Sustainable tourism, including ecotourism.

10YFP Programmes

Secretariat



Programmes will serve as “umbrellas” that bring together existing and/or develop new initiatives and partnerships to fill capacity and knowledge needs and “gaps” – for **collective impact**

They will **build synergies and cooperation** between stakeholders, and allow **scaling up and replication** of policies, voluntary measures, management practices, and partnerships promoting the shift to SCP patterns,

They will use a **mix of policies** and engage all stakeholders: **governments, business, consumers and other major groups.**

Programmes are expected to **deliver capacity building and technical support at all levels:** regional, sub-regional, national and local.





Programme Criteria

Secretariat



- (a) Contribute to the **three dimensions** of sustainable development – economic, social, environmental
- (b) Respond to **national and regional needs, priorities** and circumstances
- (c) Be based on the **life cycle approach**
- (d) Be based on a **solid scientific and policy knowledge base**
- (e) Encourage the involvement of **all relevant stakeholders**
- (f) Will have **clear objectives and measures of success**

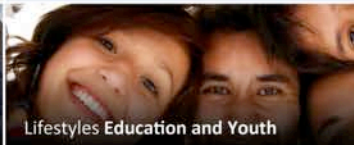

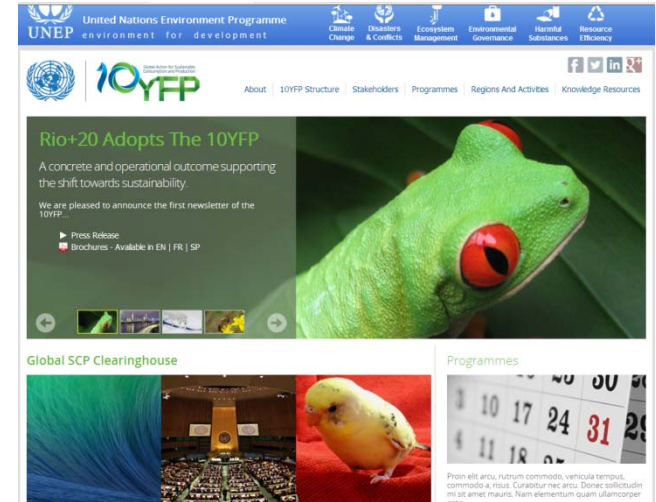

Sustainable Public Procurement

The Sustainable Public Procurement Initiative (SPPI) (which is built on the Marrakech Task Force) is formally applying to become the 10YFP Programme on SPP.

A draft concept note is being finalized and will be public for consultations with all stakeholders (including Board, NFP, IACG and stakeholders focal points) .

Partners: Members of the SPPI Multistakeholder Advisory Committee and lead organizations of SPPI thematic working groups, and other members of SPPI (including governmental organisations).

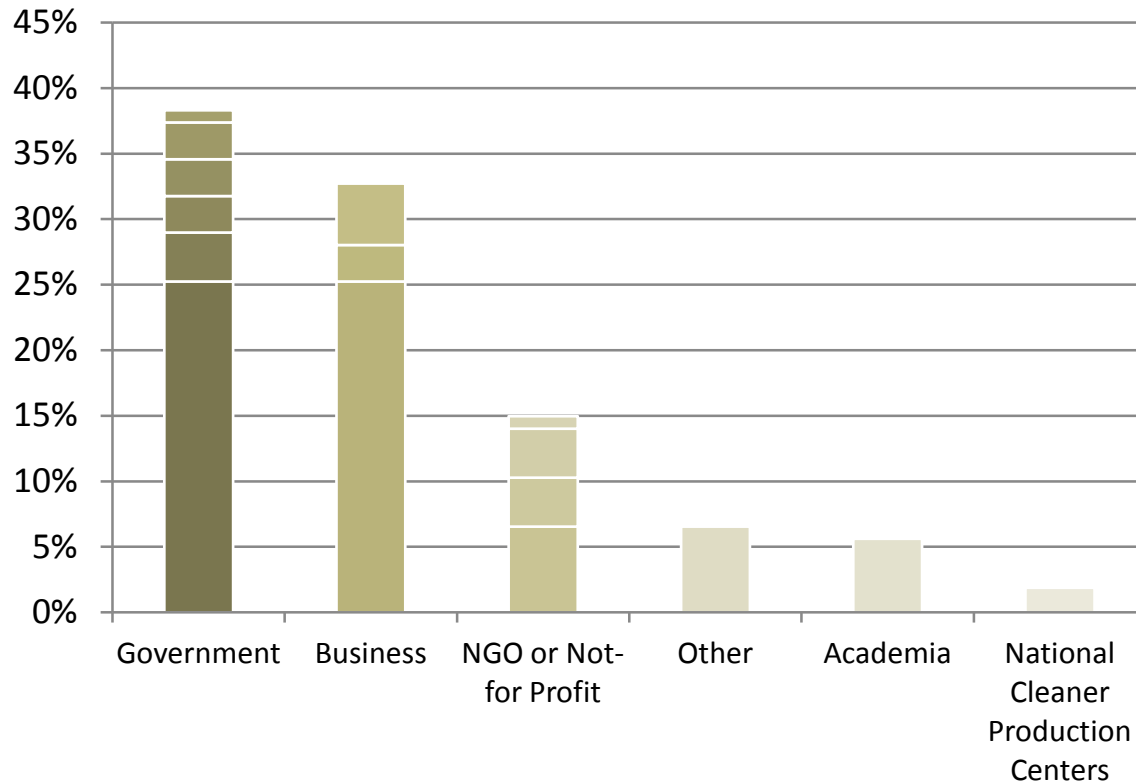

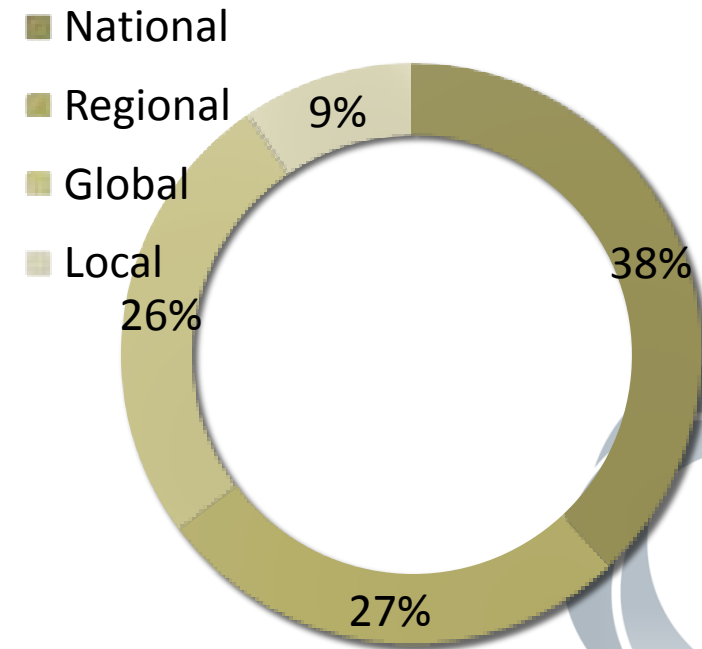

Sustainable Lifestyles & Education

- Identifying key partners interested in co-leading the research and stock taking.
- We hope the programme will be the channel for the continuation of the UN Decade of Education for Sustainable Development (DESD, 2005-2014) for SCP related topics. The 2014 World Conference on ESD in Nagoya will offer a great opportunity to engage more actors in the programme.



Sustainable Building & Construction

- Identifying key partners interested in co-leading the research and stock taking.
- Initial research and stock taking has started through the Advocacy Committee of UNEP-SBCI (Sustainable Building and Climate Initiative), including identification of tools and strategies to support implementation of sector specific policies, and to identify building sector components of national and regional SCP strategies.
- Will also include the work of the UNEP-SBCI Task Force on Supply Chains which is ‘mapping’ and identifying priorities, actors, relationships and potential green interventions in the building sector supply chain.

Criteria for New Programmes

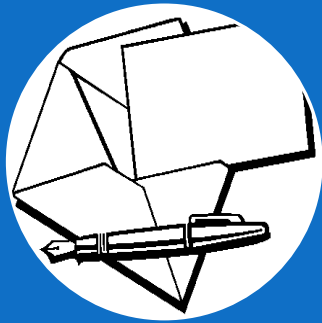
Suggested initial criteria for new 10YFP Programmes – for discussion

- 1) Have scientific-based evidence on the relevance of the new theme to achieve SCP/RE/decoupling
- 2) Existing regional and national demand from governments and other stakeholders
- 3) Existing initiatives are in place, as well as mechanisms for implementation and funding that could support a future 10YFP Programme
- 4) Interested actors are identified to start the 5 steps process for the programme development
- 5)



Suggested process for Approval of new programme Areas

For discussion with the Board members



Expression of interest through letters to Secretariat, regional declaration or meetings outcomes



Secretariat gather information and check against criteria



Board is consulted for approval of new areas for 10YFP programmes. If agreed, launches process for its development (following 5 steps model)



SDG AND POST 2015

Report of the High Level Panel on post 2015 development agenda - considering how SCP could contribute to SDGs, post 2015, sustainable development.

1. MDGs failed to address the need to shift to SCP patterns
2. The world's consumption and production patterns need to be managed in a more sustainable and equitable way
3. Moving to sustainable patterns of work and life is necessary in a world of limited resources
4. Mobilizing economic, social and environmental action together required to **irreversibly** reduce poverty
